Once again they would target the Oregon Railway and Navigation Company, the Fast Express Number 6 that departed from Portland at 8:15 P.M. on September 23, 1903, bound for Chicago.

A few days earlier, Hoehn had procured a small rowboat, which he rowed down the Columbia River to the town of Corbett, some 15 miles east of Portland, and stashed it along the banks. He then hitched a train ride back to Goble.
